

Shambles bring readers the story of Delia Arco, a school social worker in a Texas refinery town in the year 2000. At the outset of the academic year, Delia, who is white and has just adopted a black baby girl, lives a financially insecure, socially isolated life. Over the following months, Delia is pulled in every direction—by an unstable intern whose parents' murder has been immortalized in a true crime book; by the sudden death of the mother who abandoned Delia as a baby; by the reform school girls and public high school kids she counsels out of—and, inadvertently, into—dramatic troubles; and by the men in her life, who all seem to Delia to take more than they give. Delia learns good mothering, after having had none of her own, and navigates threats both real and perceived, threats highlighted and made urgent by her new motherhood. She struggles to know who she can engage and who she must keep at bay. And she navigates one terrible night when everything she has worked to build threatens to blow apart.

This is the story of life in the aftermath—of loss, of trauma, of neglect—and the bridges we build to move past survival toward a hopeful future.

DEBRA MONROE has written four books of fiction and one memoir: The Source of Trouble; A Wild, Cold State; Newfangled; Shambles; and On the Outskirts of Normal. Her books have been widely reviewed and won many awards, including The Flannery O'Connor Award and the John Gardner Fellowship. They've been nominated for the National Book Award, listed as "Required Reading" in Vanity Fair, as "Our Picks" on Salon.com, as "Recommended Reading" in O: The Oprah Magazine, and named in annual "Best Ten Books" lists by Elle magazine and The Barnes and Noble Review. She lives in Austin, Texas, and teaches in the MFA program at Texas State University.
